Note

1. The treatment must be to a standard that should ensure cattle are tick free when presented for inspection.
 2. The Biosecurity Manual (Cattle Ticks) provides guidance on the intervals from the last preliminary treatment within which the stock can be presented to an accredited certifier:
 - Acaricides – by spraying or plunge dipping – a minimum period of four (4) days and a maximum of seven (7) days; or
 - Endectocides – [Macrocyclic lactones that have a full claim for the control of cattle ticks] by injection or pour on a minimum period of six (6) days and a maximum of nine (9) days.
1. Movement record means a national vendor declaration (NVD) or other document (however called) completed under a law of another state that complies with, or substantially complies with, the requirements of a movement record. 2. Relevant person under the Biosecurity Act 2014.
